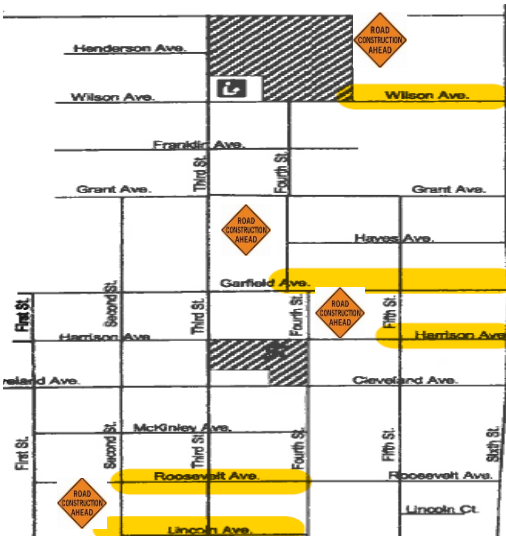

INTERESTED IN COACHING?

Coaches are needed for all age divisions. There will be a 48-hour window after registration closes to find coaches. The 48-hour mark will determine how many coaches there will be for each activity. Note that team size will be determined by the number of coaches. If you are willing to coach please contact the Recreation Department.

Adult Coed Softball:

Leisure (ages 14+) and Recreation leagues (ages 16+) offered. Team fee \$400 with a 10% discount online on July 15th & 16th. 8 scheduled games and 6 guaranteed.

Youth Flag Football: Ages 6-7, 8-9, & 10-12. Ages 6-7 scheduled 6 games. Fee \$40. Ages 8-9 & 10-12 scheduled 8 games. Games begin Sept 9. Fee \$50.

Start Smart Flag Football: Ages 4-6. A parent/child interactive course that teaches the basics of football. Session dates Sept 5 - Oct. 10th. Fee \$50.

Youth Soccer:

Ages 4-5, 6-7, 8-9 & 10-12. Ages 4-5 & 6-7 scheduled 6 games. Fee \$40. Ages 8-9 & 10-12 scheduled 8 games. Games begin Sept 9. Fee \$50.

Start Smart Soccer: Ages 3-5. A parent/child interactive course that teaches the basics of soccer. Session dates Sept 5 - Oct 10th. Fee \$50.

Indian Peaks Girls Competitive Fast Pitch Softball:

10U, 12U, 14U two regular season games every Saturday starting Sept 9. Teams limited to 14 girls with tryouts if more than 14 register. Uniform is not included in the registration fee. Fee \$200

RESOLUTION NO. 16-2017

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF WELLINGTON, COLORADO
RESTRICTING THE USE OF OUTDOOR WATERING**

WHEREAS, Section 13-1-160(a) of the Wellington Municipal Code concerning Sprinkling and Water Scarcity states, the Board of Trustees shall have the authority to establish such rules and regulations so as to limit the days and hours of outdoor watering or sprinkling or to limit the use of water in such manner as it shall deem necessary. Such regulations may be adopted by resolution and shall become effective immediately upon passage.; and

WHEREAS, The watershed from which Wellington receives it's water is experiencing high demand; and

WHEREAS, up to 75% of water is lost through evaporation when watering is done during the heat of the day.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Wellington, Colorado, that:

Section 1: VOLUNTARY WATERING RESTRICTIONS

Effective immediately upon passage, outdoor watering with the exception of hand watering of trees and shrubs shall be limited as follow:

1. No outdoor watering between the hours of 10:00 am and 5:00 pm.
2. Limit outdoor watering to 2 days a week.
 - a) Addresses ending in an odd number such as; 1,3,5,7or 9 should water only on calendar days ending in an odd number, 2 times a week.
 - b) Addresses ending in an even number such as; 0,2,4,6 or 8 should water only on calendar days ending in an even number, 2 times a week.
3. After rainstorms, turn off automatic watering systems until lawns start to get dry again.
4. Watering should be limited to only that which is necessary to keep lawns and other landscape plants alive and healthy.
5. Sprinkler systems should be maintained and adjusted to prevent water running off the lawn and into the street gutter.
6. If cars are washed outdoors at home, washing should be done with buckets and rinsed by hose with a spray nozzle. Avoid letting water run


Section 2: Water Wells

If outdoor watering using adjudicated water wells ("Non-Utillity Watering") occurs, the well owner shall at all times when water is being applied conspicuously post the property as being watered using "well water" or "non-potable water."
