#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Family Dollar Store #29016 has submitted their annual renewal for a Fermented Malt Beverage and Wine (city) liquor license. The store has also submitted an application for a Modification of Premise.

#### **BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION**

Family Dollar Store #29016 submitted their annual renewal application to the Town Clerk's Office on December 16, 2024. Staff has reviewed the application and notes the establishment is in good standing with the Colorado Secretary of State and is current with sales tax.

After inspection from the Larimer County Sheriff's Office, the applicant submitted a Modification of Premise application to the Town Clerk's Office. The diagram did not change drastically, but the updated premise allows the applicant to place beer and wine in new locations as well as notes the storage location. The proposed updated diagram is included for the Authority's review. LCSO's inspection is attached to the item, and staff would note the items called out in the inspection report would be addressed by approval of the modification of premise.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff has identified the following options for consideration:

- 1. Approve the Retail Liquor License Renewal Application and the Modification of Premise.
- 2. Postpone to hold a hearing on the Applications after the hearing is posted on the licensed premise for at least 10 days and notice has been provided to the applicant for at least 10 days prior to the hearing.
- 3. Deny the applications for good cause. Good Cause for the purpose of denying a license renewal means:
  - a. The licensee or applicant has violated, does not meet, or has failed to comply with any of the terms, conditions, or provisions of article 3 or any rules promulgated pursuant to article 3;
  - b. The licensee or applicant has failed to comply with any special terms or conditions that were placed on its license in prior disciplinary proceedings or arose in the context of potential disciplinary proceedings;
  - c. Evidence that the licensed premises have been operated in a manner that adversely affects the public health, welfare, or safety of the immediate neighborhood in which the establishment is located, which evidence must include a continuing pattern of fights, violent activity, or disorderly conduct.



#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

A request is being made to proceed with the purchase of a new vehicle for the Parks and Recreation Department. This purchase is included in the approved 2025 CIP budget, as shown in Park Fund G/L 211-80-5001 in the amount of \$75,000. The proposed cost is \$69,324, through the FIN Ford Fleet and State Award program, which is a State of Colorado program that provides value-priced vehicles, for state and local government agencies.

#### **BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION**

This truck will be used to meet the Town's parks and recreation goals in relation to the addition of the Parks and Recreation Operations Supervisor position, acceptance of dedicated Harvest Park, and looking to the future for potential park, trails and open spaces that the department maintains. This truck is being upfitted with a V-Plow, which will improve the services the department can provide and assist with during snow events. The Town solicited quotes from various local dealerships, and received 4 quotes on potential vehicles. This vehicle best fit the needs of the Parks and Recreation Department and falls within the proposed budget. The proposed vendor is Ken Garff Ford Greeley.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Updates to the Town of Wellington Fee Schedule are presented for review.

#### **BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION**

Continual review of the fee schedule is an integral step to ensure costs are recovered for services provided by the Town of Wellington, Colorado. The current Town of Wellington Fee Schedule Effective January 1, 2025, was approved by the Board of Trustees on September 24, 2024.

The current fee schedule separates fees for cremation and casket grave space sizes. However, the Town Clerk, Hannah Hill, has reviewed cemetery operations and determined that Highland Park Cemetery does not have designated cremation sections, as all lots are uniformly sized. To align with this layout, the fee schedule has been updated to a single lot price for residents and single lot price for non-residents, with burial type differences reflected in the existing opening and closing fee structure, which remains unchanged.

Additionally, six park fees have been adjusted to better align with cost of service to the Town for operations and maintenance, and two new park fees have been included. Of the six adjustments, three fees were reduced, one fee was increased, and two fees were increased with clarification added to better describe when the fees will occur. Fees for access to electrical hookups have been added.

Lastly, during a historical look back on the fee schedule, it has been noted that Resolution No. 08-2023 states that the Parks and Recreation Manager has the authority to set pricing for recreation programs. As such, recreation program fees have been removed from the fee schedule. This does not include park fees.

 "Fees imposed for recreational programs, advertisement, and sale of goods provided by the Town of Wellington shall be set at the discretion of the Parks & Recreation Manager, not to exceed the cost of the individual programs. Imposed fees will align with the Cost Recovery Model for the Parks & Recreation Department."

Including recreation programs in the fee schedule can create confusion if pricing were to change prior to the fee schedule being reviewed again by the Board of Trustees. Pricing for recreation programs is determined at the time of program planning by staff and is posted at the time of program registration. Please note: Utility rates (water, wastewater, stormwater) were previously removed from the fee schedule by Resolution No. 49-2024 and have been posted separately at https://www.wellingtoncolorado.gov/155/Water-



Sewer. Water and wastewater capital investment fees approved by Ordinance No. 12-2024 were included in the Fee Schedule Effective January 1, 2025, when posted publicly at https://www.wellingtoncolorado.gov/158/Finance, and remain unchanged.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This is a technical amendment to Chapter 10 of the Town of Wellington Municipal Code being proposed to clarify that all violations of the Town Municipal Code are subject to a defined penalty.

#### **BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION**

Violations of the Town of Wellington Municipal Code are subject to penalties under Chapter 1, distinguished by whether the violation is a criminal violation or a non-criminal violation. Criminal violations are subject to a maximum fine of \$2,650.00 and up to 364 days in jail. See 1-4-20(b), attached. Noncriminal violations (often described as municipal infractions) are subject to a maximum penalty of \$1,000.00, with no possibility of jail time. See 1-4-20(a), attached.

In addition to sentencing differences, the distinction between a criminal and a noncriminal violation has other effects in both process and effect for defendants. Defendants in criminal cases, due to the possibility of jail time, are eligible for trials by jury and, if the defendant is indigent, appointment of counsel by the court. Because noncriminal charges do not bring the risk of incarceration, these do not apply. Further, depending on the nature of the offence, there are differences for how Larimer County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) enforces.

Because of the significant difference in how these cases are handled and the impact on defendants, the Municipal Code has explicit lists in Chapter 10 for which municipal offenses are criminal and which are noncriminal. See 10-1-40(c) defining noncriminal offenses and (d) defining criminal offenses.

While the two lists were intended to provide clarity, having two mutually exclusive lists like this in code is not a best practice, as it requires the Town to amend the Code in multiple places every time a change is made. Failure to do so causes a lack of clarity for everyone or possible inability of the court to enforce the code at all. For example, how would the court enforce a violation if it were not included on either list or how would it sentence a violation if it inadvertently were on both lists?

The former was the case in a recent case where the defendant's attorney objected to the imposition of any sentence after a guilty plea due to the offense being inadvertently excluded from these lists. Upon review, we have identified six offenses in Chapter 10 that are excluded from both lists:

- 10-4-40 Damage or removal of street signs
- 10-6-180 Fireworks, explosives and firearms
- 10-7-50 Loitering and other acts around schools
- 10-8-100 Alcoholic beverages in certain places
- 10-9-50 Dangerous or deadly weapons; forfeiture.
- 10-9-60 Selling weapons to intoxicated persons



It has been the position of the Town Attorney and was the judgment of the Court in a recent case that any violation of the Town Code is a municipal infraction (a noncriminal violation) unless defined as a criminal violation explicitly. The proposed ordinance addresses these issues. This eliminates the need for a separate list of noncriminal offenses and ensures unlisted violations default to noncriminal status. By reducing ambiguity, the ordinance simplifies enforcement and aligns with best practices.

This change, previously discussed as part of broader Chapter 10 amendments, has been expedited due to recent challenges in Municipal Court.

#### TOWN OF WELLINGTON

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 01-2025**

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING A TECHNICAL AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 10 OF THE WELLINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO GENERAL OFFENSES.

WHEREAS, the Town of Wellington, pursuant to its police powers as a statutory Colorado municipality, is authorized to adopt ordinances to protect the health, safety, morals, and general welfare in the Town of Wellington; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wellington Municipal Code, at Chapter 1, Article 4, defines the General Penalties for violations of the Town Code, differentiating between criminal and noncriminal violations; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wellington Municipal Code, at Chapter 10, defines General Offenses, including a variety of criminal and noncriminal violations; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to provide additional clarity for the residents of the Town and its courts on which offenses are deemed criminal or noncriminal violations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF WELLINGTON, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. SUBSECTION c of SECTION 40 of ARTICLE 1 of CHAPTER 10 of the Wellington Municipal Code is repealed and replaced in its entirety as follows:
  - (c) Violations of this Code are designated noncriminal violations, except those designated as criminal violations in subsection (d) below. Any person charged with violating any noncriminal provision of this Code shall not be subject to incarceration upon conviction. Further, such person shall not be entitled to a trial by jury.
- 2. Severability If any clause or provision of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of the clause or provisions will not affect the validity of any of the remaining clauses or provisions of this ordinance.
- 3. All other ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent or conflicting with this ordinance or any portion hereof are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.
- 4. This ordinance is deemed necessary for the immediate protection of the health, welfare and safety of the community.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Wellington, Colorado and ordered published this 28th day of January, 2025, and ordered to become effective 30 days from the date of publication.

#### **CHAPTER 1, ARTICLE 4 General Penalty**

#### Sec. 1-4-10. Violations.

It is a violation of this Code for any person to do any act which is forbidden or declared to be unlawful or to fail to do or perform any act required in this Code. (Ord. 11-2007 §1)

#### Sec. 1-4-20. General penalty for violation.

- (a) Except as may otherwise be provided herein, any person convicted of a noncriminal violation, as designated in Section 10-1-40(c) of this Code, may be fined by an amount not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) except as hereinafter provided in Section 1-4-30 below. In addition, such person shall pay all costs and expenses in the case, including attorney fees.
- (b) Except as may otherwise be provided herein, any person convicted of a criminal violation, as designated in Section 10-1-40(d) of this Code, may be incarcerated for a period not to exceed three hundred sixty-four (364) days or fined by an amount not to exceed two thousand six hundred fifty dollars (\$2,650.00), or both, except as hereinafter provided in Section 1-4-30 below. In addition, such person shall pay all costs and expenses in the case, including attorney fees.
- (c) Any voluntary plea of guilty, no contest or nolo contendere to the original charge or to a lesser or substituted charge shall subject the person so pleading to all of the fines and/or penalties applicable to the charge for which the plea was entered.
- (d) Where any violation is a continuing offense, each day that the violation continues shall be considered and held to be a separate and distinct offense. (Ord. 18-1994 §1-106; Ord. 11-2007 §1)

(Ord. No. 10-2019, 7-23-19)

#### Sec. 1-4-30. Application of penalties to juveniles.

Every person who, at the time of commission of the offense, was at least ten (10) but not yet eighteen (18) years of age, and who is subsequently convicted of or pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, a violation of any provision of this Code classified as noncriminal pursuant to Section 10-1-40(c) herein, shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per violation or count. Every such juvenile who is subsequently convicted of or pleads guilty, no contest or nolo contendere to a violation of any provision of this Code classified as criminal pursuant to Section 10-1-40(d) herein, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per violation or count. Any voluntary plea of guilty or nolo contendere to the original charge or to a lesser or substituted charge shall subject the person so pleading to all fines and/or penalties applicable to the original charge. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to prohibit incarceration in an appropriate facility, at the time of charging, of a juvenile violating any section of this Code. (Ord. 18-1994 §1-107; Ord. 11-2007 §1)

#### Sec. 1-4-40. Altering or tampering with Code; penalty.

Any person who shall alter, change or amend this Code, except in the manner prescribed in this Article, or who shall alter or tamper with this Code in any manner so as to cause the ordinances of the Town to be misrepresented thereby, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable as provided in this Article. (Ord. 11-2007 §1)

#### Sec. 1-4-50. Penalty for violations of ordinances adopted after adoption of Code.

Any person who shall violate any provision of any ordinance of a permanent and general nature passed or adopted after adoption of this Code, either before or after it has been inserted in this Code by a supplement, shall,

upon conviction thereof, be punishable as provided by Section 1-4-20 unless another penalty is specifically provided for the violation. (Ord. 11-2007 §1)

#### **CHAPTER 10, ARTICLE 1 General Provisions**

#### Sec. 10-1-10. Legislative purpose.

It is the purpose of this Code to provide for the public health, safety and welfare of the Town. (Ord. 18-1994 §1-102)

#### Sec. 10-1-20. Local question.

It is the intention of the Board of Trustees that the ordinances and provisions of this Chapter deal with matters of "local" and "mixed" state and local concern and that no provision of this Chapter is to be construed expressly or by implication to permit conduct that is illegal under the laws of the State or to prohibit conduct that is expressly permitted by the laws of the State. The provisions of this Chapter are to be construed to apply to misdemeanors and other minor and petty offenses only and are not to be interpreted to apply to conduct that is defined as a felony under state law. (Ord. 18-1994 §1-103)

#### Sec. 10-1-30. Application.

- (a) A person is subject to prosecution in the Municipal Court for a violation committed through the conduct of such person or through the conduct of another for whom such person is legally accountable, if:
  - (1) The conduct constitutes a violation and is committed either wholly or partly within the Town;
  - (2) The conduct outside the Town constitutes an attempt, as defined by this Chapter, to commit a violation within the Town;
  - (3) The conduct outside the Town constitutes a conspiracy to commit a violation within the Town, and an act in furtherance of the conspiracy occurs in the Town; or
  - (4) The conduct within the Town constitutes an attempt, solicitation or conspiracy to commit in another jurisdiction a violation prohibited under the laws of this Town and such other jurisdiction.
- (b) Whether a violator is in or outside the Town is immaterial to the commission of a violation based on an omission to perform a duty imposed by the law of the Town.
- (c) Town, as used in this Section and in any summons, summons and complaint or complaint alleging a violation of this Code or any ordinance, includes both the area within the territorial limits of the Town, and also those areas over which extraterritorial police power has been granted by state statutes. It is the intent of the Board of Trustees to extend the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipal Court as widely as possible. However, where specific sections of this Code require that the violation occur "within the Town" then the offense is limited to the territorial limits of the Town. (Ord. 18-1994 §1-105)

#### Sec. 10-1-40. Violations.

- (a) Any act or omission declared to be a violation, unlawful, required or prohibited by the phrase no person shall or similar mandatory language in or by this Code, any ordinance of the Town or any rule promulgated thereunder constitutes a violation.
- (b) Unless otherwise specifically provided in this Code, an ordinance of the Town or a rule promulgated thereunder, every day of a violation of this Code, ordinance or rule constitutes a separate violation.
- (c) The following sections Violations of this Code are designated noncriminal violations, except those designated as criminal violations in subsection (d) below. Any person charged with violating any noncriminal provision of this Code-so designated shall not be subject to incarceration upon conviction. Further, such person shall not be entitled to a trial by jury.

#### Sec. 10-1-50. Statute of limitations.

No person shall be prosecuted, tried or punished for any violation under this Code or any ordinance unless the action for said violation is instituted within one (1) year of the date of the alleged violation, but the statute of limitations within which a prosecution must be instituted shall be tolled for any period in which a prosecution is pending against the accused for the same conduct, even if the summons, the complaint or the summons and complaint that commence the prosecution is quashed or the proceedings thereon are set aside or reversed on appeal. (Ord. 18-1994 §1-109)

#### Sec. 10-1-60. Penalties not released by repeal.

- (a) The repeal, revision, amendment or consolidation of any section of this Code does not constitute a bar to the prosecution and punishment of an act already committed in violation of the section so repealed, unless the repealing, revising, amending or consolidating ordinance expressly so provides.
- (b) Any such section so repealed, amended, revised or consolidated shall remain in full force and effect for the purpose of sustaining all actions, suits, proceedings and prosecutions brought thereunder that arose before the effective date of the repeal, amendment, revision or consolidation. (Ord. 18-1994 §1-110)

#### Sec. 10-1-70. Authority.

(a) Authority to detain temporarily.

- (1) A police officer may stop any person who the officer reasonably suspects is committing, has committed or is about to commit a violation of this Code or any ordinance of the Town, and may require that person to give his or her name, address and an explanation of his or her actions.
- (2) When a police officer has stopped a person for questioning pursuant to this Subsection (a) and reasonably suspects that the officer's personal safety requires it, the officer may conduct a pat-down search of that person for weapons.
- (3) A police officer may stop and temporarily detain a person for the purpose of issuing or serving a summons or summons and complaint.
- (b) Authority to charge. A peace officer may issue a summons and complaint or sign a complaint against any person for any violation of this Code or any ordinance of the Town if:
  - (1) The violation has been or is being committed by a person in the officer's presence; or
  - (2) The officer has probable cause to believe that a violation has been or is being committed by the person and that the person has been or is committing it.
- (c) Authority to arrest and incarcerate.
  - (1) A police officer may arrest a person for a violation of this Code or any ordinance of the Town if:
    - a. The violation has been or is being committed by a person in the officer's presence; or
    - b. The officer has probable cause to believe that a violation has been or is being committed by the person and that the person has been or is committing it.
  - (2) Whenever any police officer is authorized by this Code to arrest any person, the officer has the authority to incarcerate that person if the officer has probable cause to believe that one (1) or more of the following conditions exist:
    - a. The person is not likely to desist from the conduct alleged to constitute a violation after issuance of a summons;
    - b. The person is unlikely to appear in Municipal Court in response to a summons (but the fact that the defendant does not reside in the Town is not alone such probable cause);
    - c. The person refuses or is unable to post the bond required by this Code;
    - d. The person refuses service of a summons;
    - e. The person refuses to sign the promise of appearance, if any, on the summons;
    - f. The person refuses to identify himself or herself by giving a complete name and address verifiable by reasonable supporting data; or
    - g. The person falsely identifies himself or herself.
  - (3) A police officer shall incarcerate any person when the officer has a warrant or writ commanding that such person be arrested or has received information, which the officer reasonably believes to be reliable, that such warrant or writ exists.
- (d) Use of force. An arrest may be made on any day and at any time of the day or night. All necessary and reasonable force may be used in making an arrest. All necessary and reasonable force may be used to effect an entry upon any building or property or part thereof to make an authorized arrest.
- (e) Town Attorney as prosecutor. The Town Attorney shall act as the prosecutor and represent the Town in all Municipal Court proceedings as appropriate, with all the privileges, immunities, powers and duties of such office. (Ord. 18-1994 §1-206)









# Wellington Water and Wastewater Utilities Monthly Production and Operational Summary Report As of January 1, 2025

#### **Monthly Production Summary**

- Water
  - O Total December monthly volumetric production to meet demand was 19 million gallons (MG), which is below average production for the last 5 years.
    - The Conventional Plant produced 19 MG.
  - The Nanofiltration Plant was taken offline in November for maintenance. It is anticipated to stay offline through February 2025.
  - O Please see the attached charts for various additional data related to drinking water production.
- Wastewater
  - December Summary
    - The total influent volume for December was approximately 17 MG, which is below average production for the last 5 years.
    - Hydraulic loading was at 0.54 million gallons per day (MGD). This hydraulic loading represents 60% of the maximum permitted hydraulic capacity.
    - Organic loading was 1,524 pounds of BOD, which is below average for December in the last 5 years. This represents 58% of the maximum permitted organic capacity.

#### **Monthly Operational Summary**

- Water Treatment Plants
  - Conventional Plant
    - Operational all month without issue.


- The Project team was notified of another delay to the Automatic Transfer Switch (ATS) required to automatically switch the facility to generator power in the event of a power outage. These parts have been on order for over two years. This is noted as an industry-wide issue with ATS parts. Automatic Transfer switches are required by CDPHE to proceed with the plant startup. The team has sourced temporary ATS units that were brought to the site and will be used until the permanent ATSs arrive and are installed.
  - The final ATS shipped as scheduled and arrived on site in early December. Due to the upcoming holidays and the complicated shutdowns required to install the ATS while keeping the plant functional the installation has been scheduled for January, 2025.


#### **Contingency Update**

- Contractor Contingency
  - o Inter Plant Pump Station Modifications
    - Following startup of the new plant it was discovered that the existing pumps in the inter plant pump station (IPPS) had degraded to the point that they were unable to keep up with the new flow rates produced by the new digester decanting equipment. It was decided to replace the IPPS pumps but also at the same time replace the guiderails, piping, and other accessories as they are the same age or older than the pumps and not risk a future shutdown for maintenance or replacement. Total cost to the contractor contingency is \$91,495.55.
  - Ocontractor contingency currently has \$38,026.50 remaining, which is 2% of the original contingency.


#### Town Contingency


- O Town operators requested that HOA (Hand, Off, Auto) controls be added to the digester blowers as there was no local control for the blowers within the UV Building. The only controls to turn the blowers on and off existed within the SCADA system. Operators saw this as a safety and maintenance issue as without local control there was no way to quickly turn off the equipment. Total cost to the owner contingency is \$22,225.00.
- Owner contingency currently has \$73,465.50 remaining, which is 3% of the original contingency.














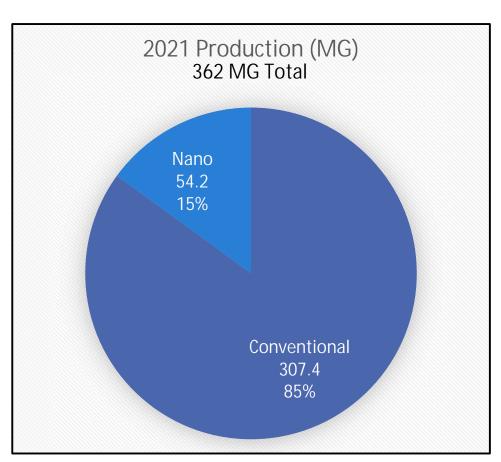
























